Purpose: The Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority (Water Authority) is planning the Bosque Water Reclamation Facility (Bosque WRF) Project (Project) to address anticipated future capacity limitations of the Westside wastewater collection system while expanding the beneficial use of reclaimed water. The Project will be built in three phases: 1) Construction of the Bosque WRF to a treatment capacity of 5 million gallons per day (mgd), which will include construction of infrastructure to connect existing collection system pipelines to the reclamation facility, modifications to the existing stormwater pond, and construction of a nature-based vegetated and earthen-lined channel to convey reclaimed water to the river; 2) Buildout with additional equipment needed to increase treatment capacity to 10 mgd within the existing Bosque WRF property; and 3) Future phase design and build of infrastructure to expand reuse to the Water Authority's Westside service area.

The Project (Phases 1 and 2) will intercept gravity flow from the existing collection system and treat it, using advanced technology, to meet quality standards for reclaimed water set by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED). The Project is a key component of the Water Authority's long-term water resource planning portfolio identified in *Water 2120: Securing Our Water Future* and is consistent with the State of New Mexico's 50-Year Water Plan. Future phase work will allow for beneficial reuse of treated wastewater for irrigation on the Westside.

The Water Authority has submitted a preliminary application for funding from the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) loan program to complete Phase 1 of the Project. The purpose of this public meeting is to provide notice of the proposed project, identify issues of concern, review the range of alternatives analyzed, identify potential cooperating agencies and other stakeholders, and enlist public participation and awareness.
